Tony Conner, Watercolorist



This will not come as a surprise – instead of meeting indoors for our October meeting, we will hold a Zoom meeting. Members and guests are invited to join us. Members will be sent the link to join. The guest fee is \$5 for non-members.

If it is possible to separate the artist from the painter, then as an artist, Tony Conner is methodical, reflective and circumspect, while as a painter he can best be described as intense and energetic. His paintings are uniquely expressive in use of contrasts of value and color and built on powerful and dynamic compositions.

Tony's paintings are widely exhibited in juried, group and solo exhibits. His work has been included in a number of national juried exhibits including the New England Watercolor Society National Biennial, Adirondacks National Exhibition of American Watercolors, and the

Hudson Valley Art Association Annual National Exhibition, among others.

Tony is a Signature Member of both the New England and Vermont Watercolor Societies and an active member of several other watercolor and art societies and an Artist Member of the Salmagundi Club, New York.

A native of Winchester, Virginia, Tony currently works from his studio in Bennington, Vermont. According to Tony, "What attracts me to a particular scene has to do with the pattern of individual objects, contrasts of color, value, or intensity and, most of all, the quality of light at a particular moment." ... "Watercolor is my main medium of choice. It is truly the medium of light since much of its beauty and character result from the interaction of transparent color and the light that passes through, from paper to eye."

"More than twenty years ago I lived and worked in Detroit, Michigan. I was

hired as the Executive Director of a social service agency. The people of Detroit however were like diamonds in the rough. Full of joy and faith and compassion for one another. The social work was rewarding but the visuals were overwhelmingly sad.

That is when I rediscovered that I could create the beauty that I longed for with my own hands, some paint and the support of a loving husband. I began to paint, first in watercolor, then in oils. I took classes at the Detroit Institute of Art and joined the Scarab Club (artists guild).

I loved to paint from an early age. I took classes in high school and college. I exhibited and I was asked to draw the cover of my College yearbook. But throughout the years my art was left behind in search of other things. Today I am a widow and retired from the ministry as an Episcopal Priest.

It has taken time, but the source of my contentment is now at my fingertips. I am often frustrated by the distance between what I want to put on a canvas and what I end up with! But the search and the practice keep me going. I am honored to be asked to write this for the Dedham Art Association, a wonderful place to keep my chin up when the chips are down.

O'Donohue writes: "The wonder of the Beautiful is its ability to surprise us. With swift, sheer grace, it is like a divine breath that blows the heart open." What better words could describe the reason to push on in anticipation of that surprise!

Whether it's the beauty that we see or the beauty that we create, the journey is worth the toil that is the search.

The creative process is a profound act of courage. Perfect or not it is what the mind, heart and soul produce. What I create is visual - the conclusion of the process. But, for me, the act of connecting the heart with the hand and the eye is what I seek.

Those that view what appears on the canvas are witnesses to an internal process that is sometimes successful and sometimes not. The picture is the conclusion of hours and sometimes days-long process of reaching an otherwise invisible interior world."


