Joelle's Artist Statement



"Light, alignment, vibrant color and simplicity define my work. I find great joy in a full range of subjects sharing an intensity of light and saturation of color. From the intense, sun-permeated

colors of Provence, to the moist blue-green values of New England, I discover the vibrancy, subtlety and shadow that nature may offer at a given moment. I also delight in the form, texture and color found in everyday objects."

Joelle was born and raised in Normandy, France and returns every year to visit family and friends and rediscovers the endless supply of inspiring scenes, each begging to be painted. Inspiration is also abundant in her adopted New England. home, where the coast of Maine, orchards of Massachusetts and charming architecture are welcoming to any artist.

Artist of the Month: Joan Percy



I am an artist, a colorist and an award-winning painter exhibiting in juried and non-juried shows for thirty years. Colors call to me and dictate the mood of softness or vibrancy. Light inspires me as the shapes move in and out. My style of painting is loose, freeflowing and nontraditional. The emerging painting

dictates to me rather than imposing my will upon it. Colors and muted shapes give the quality of semi-abstraction – there and not quite there. I am greatly influenced by my training as an art therapist and my association with the analysts following Carl Jung's psychology of dream interpretation. My paintings would reveal my soul's connection to my inner life – the dream communication with the unconscious, symbols and synchronicity of events that help to direct my life.

Born and raised on the outskirts of Boston, I ventured to another sea and way of living in California, staying there for 30 years. My college education earned me a B.A. cum laude in art and an M.A. in art therapy.

Returning to Massachusetts, as a practicing artist, I have won awards such as the Carolyn B. Harvey Memorial Award for Creativity, North River Festival of the Arts and I was selected as Artist-in-Residence for the Cape Cod Art Association. I've also received awards from local art associations.

For thirty-five years I have been an art therapist and artist introducing the spirit of spontaneous art to all ages. I have also been a consultant working with severely handicapped neurologically impaired children at Carter School, a Boston public school. I have designed and conducted many healing art workshops and classes in art and creativity. For the last 15 years I have taught watercolor classes at senior centers. My life has been fulfilled by my work in art therapy and as an artist and instructor. For that I am deeply grateful.
